MEDICATION REGIME CHANGES DUE TO TRIKAFTA IN CYSTIC FIBROSIS – A QUALITATIVE STUDY

Individual Living with Cystic Fibrosis Participant Information:-

What is this research about? This research hopes to look at how Trikafta has changed the burden of treatment regimens for people with cystic fibrosis (CF). There is a lack of research looking into the changes people have made to medications and other forms of treatments after starting Trikafta.

My name is Matthew Corbett, and I am junior doctor at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital. I'm interested in CF and hope to pursue further training in respiratory medicine. With this research we are wanting to hear what people have to say and how they feel about the current treatment regimens that people with CF go through. We want to know if Trikafta is relieving the burden of all the treatments and how we can help to further improve this. Inclusion and exclusion criteria: You are eligible to participate in this study if you are over the age of 16 and are currently using Trikafta.

This survey contains 12 questions and will take approximately 5 -10 minutes to complete. You will then be invited to do an interview via zoom to further elaborate on these questions.
