- 5. The <u>UWA Research Integrity Policy</u> requires researchers to store data in the UWA Institutional Research Data Store (IRDS) or equivalent University approved Research data store. A list of UWA approved storage and the level of data sensitivity each storage system can contain is described in the Research Data Management Toolkit under <u>Storage and Retention</u>. If the research involves children or a clinical trial, the research would be classified as "Highly Restricted". - 6. WA Universities Data Storage and Disposal Authority (WAUSDA) requires data to be retained for research with outcomes that are classed as minor for 7 years after date of publication, or 7 years after conclusion of the project, whichever is later, then destroyed (WAUSDA 12.4.5). For research involving clinical trials, and for projects involving children there are additional requirements (WAUSDA 12.4.3) and WAUSDA 12.4.4 respectively)
